Glass  Empty and rinse. Discard lids in trash. Plastics  Empty and rinse. Caps and lids OK if left on.  ONLY containers smaller than 2.5 gallons are recyclable.  Food containers: margarine, yogurt, cooking oil, condiments, peanut butter  beverage bottles and jugs: soda, water, juice, milk  detergent bottles, dish soap bottles  personal care bottles: shampoo, soap, etc.  clear plastic clamshells (no black or Styrofoam)  Cartons  Empty, rinse, & flatten. Throw away caps & straws. Paper Clean paper only. Flatten boxes. "Windows" in envelopes, staples, paper clips, tape all OK  ➤ newspaper, inserts, magazines, junk mail  ➤ white, colored, glossy, and construction paper  ➤ shredded paper—put in paper bag corrugated cardboard, clean pizza boxes (no grease or food)  ➤ boxboard (for example, cereal boxes)  ➤ gift wrap, gift bags, cards, gift tissue paper (no metallic inks, foil, wire, glitter)  ➤ paperback books and phonebooks	soda, beer cartons paper cups paper plates egg cartons frozen juice cartons take-out containers	butter, margarine paper towels, nap tissues Tyvek or padded hardcover books stickers & sticker	envelopes	glossy boxes that show white strands when torn (frozen food boxes) blueprints dirtied paper (pet waste, paint) copy paper packaging

## **New Recycling Items!**

### **Batteries, Ballasts, Mercury, and Fluorescent Lamps**

These can all be dropped off in the **silver box** in the labeled containers.

#### **OEM BOX-** Lamps

Including: Linear Fluorescent Lamps - 4'

Place carefully in box so that nothing gets broken.

#### **Rocon Container-** Light Bulbs

Including: UTubes, circular fluoHPS, CFL's, BIAX, incandescents, Linear Fluorescent Lamps – 2' Place carefully in box so bulbs lay flat and nothing gets broken. Please close top.

Household Batteries- Including A, C, D, 9 volt only. Place in container and close top.

<u>Non Household Batteries</u>- Including batteries with any of the following: (nickel, lead or lithium) Before bringing to Transfer station put them in a zip lock bag or tape the terminals of the batteries. Place in container and close top.

**<u>Ballasts</u>** - Place in container and close top.

Mercury Items-Including: thermometers, thermostats etc. Place in container and close top.

### **New Can and Bottle Recycling**

### **Empty Aerosol Containers**

Discard lids in trash. Do not puncture, pierce, flatten or remove nozzles. Please place empty aerosol containers from the following categories with your recycling:

- Health and beauty aids: sun block, hairspray, hair mousse, shaving cream and deodorants
- Laundry spray
- Food containers: frostings, cooking spray, whipped cream, processed cheeses
- Air Fresheners

We can't take any other type of aerosol container. Empty aerosols that once contained hazardous material are not accepted. These include, but are not limited to: spray paint, pesticides, cleaning products, craft products, adhesives, automotive sprays, waterproofing sprays, WD-40 and other lubricants. These empty aerosols should be disposed with your solid waste. If full or partially full, they need to be disposed at a Household hazardous waste collection.
